As well as adding Phil Slade's photos from the 2004 get-together to the DMGS'63 web site (www.dmgs63.org.uk), your Webmaster has finally got around to uploading extracts from the **Phoenix** magazines of 1969 and 1970, representing our last years at Drayton Manor. You can also view Adobe PDF versions of the complete magazines, which have been kindly provided by **Bryan Smith** of the 1967 DMGS intake.

I have also perused the **Phoenix** issues from 1971 to 1976 and selected a number of items which either recount the departures of various Staff who attempted to teach us during the '63-'70 years, or describe the changes that affected Drayton Manor

as a result of the alterations to Secondary Education that took place in the 1970s. You will find this selection under the heading **Beyond 1970** on the **Phoenix** page of the web site.

I note that the majority of the Staff departure tributes appear to be penned by *F.R.J.R'*, otherwise **Mr Russell** – supreme of the Stationery Cupboard. He was still contributing to *Phoenix* in the School's 50th anniversary issue (1980), but I have not seen any note of his departure.
